

WBC EURASIA REGULATORY MANUAL

Section 1: Institutional Framework

1.1 Mission Statement

WBC Eurasia operates under the guiding principles of the World Boxing Council (WBC), with a mandate to uphold and advance the sport of professional boxing throughout the Eurasian region.

Mission:

To promote safety, integrity, fairness, and excellence in professional boxing across Eurasia by implementing unified regulatory standards, supporting athlete development, and ensuring compliance with internationally recognized WBC protocols.

WBC Eurasia is committed to protecting the health and welfare of all participants while fostering a transparent and globally integrated boxing environment.

1.2 Vision Statement

Vision:

To be the premier governing authority for professional boxing across Europe, the Middle East, and Asia, recognized for regulatory excellence, athlete protection, and the development of world-class champions.

WBC Eurasia aims to serve as the official regional extension of the WBC, creating a seamless pathway from regional competition to global championship status.

1.3 Core Values

WBC Eurasia adopts and enforces the following core values in all regulatory, operational, and competitive activities:

- **Safety First:** The health and safety of boxers is paramount

- **Integrity:** Zero tolerance for corruption, manipulation, or unethical conduct
 - **Fairness:** Equal opportunity and unbiased officiating
 - **Excellence:** Commitment to the highest professional standards
 - **Transparency:** Open and accountable governance
 - **Respect:** Upholding dignity across all cultures and nations

1.4 Strategic Objectives

1.4.1 Athlete Safety & Welfare

WBC Eurasia shall:

- Enforce standardized pre-bout, post-bout, and annual medical requirements
 - Maintain a centralized medical registry and injury tracking system
 - Implement mandatory medical suspensions and international reporting protocols
 - Promote long-term athlete health programs, including neurological monitoring

1.4.2 Regulatory Harmonization

WBC Eurasia shall:

- Standardize rules, licensing requirements, and officiating criteria across member jurisdictions
 - Recognize and collaborate with national commissions and governing bodies
 - Implement digital regulatory systems for bout approvals and compliance tracking

1.4.3 Championship Pathway Development

WBC Eurasia shall:

- Establish and sanction regional titles, including:
 - WBC Eurasia Continental Championship
 - WBC Eurasia Silver Championship
 - WBC Eurasia Youth Championship
 - Maintain merit-based rankings systems aligned with WBC global rankings
 - Provide structured progression toward international championship opportunities

1.4.4 Integrity & Anti-Doping

WBC Eurasia shall:

- Enforce anti-doping protocols consistent with international standards
 - Require participation in approved testing programs where applicable
 - Maintain disciplinary procedures for violations, including suspensions and fines

1.4.5 International Coordination

WBC Eurasia shall:

- Act as the official regional liaison to the WBC
 - Ensure compliance with all WBC conventions and championship regulations
 - Facilitate cross-border recognition of suspensions, licenses, and bout results

1.4.6 Event & Commercial Development

WBC Eurasia shall:

- Support promoters in organizing sanctioned events meeting WBC standards
 - Encourage international broadcasting and sponsorship opportunities
 - Promote Eurasia as a global boxing hub
-

1.4.7 Education & Certification

WBC Eurasia shall:

- Establish certification programs for referees, judges, inspectors, and officials
 - Conduct annual training seminars and regulatory workshops
 - Maintain continuing education requirements for all licensed officials
-

1.4.8 Social Responsibility

WBC Eurasia shall:

- Promote community outreach and youth engagement programs
- Support initiatives aligned with clean sport and ethical competition

- Encourage diversity, inclusion, and international cooperation
-

1.5 Governance Alignment Clause

All policies, regulations, and strategic initiatives of WBC Eurasia shall be aligned with the rules, guidelines, and governing principles of the World Boxing Council.

In the event of any conflict, WBC global regulations shall take precedence unless otherwise authorized.

1.6 Implementation Authority

This section forms a foundational component of the WBC Eurasia Regulatory Manual and shall guide:

- Rule development and amendments
- Licensing frameworks
- Event sanctioning decisions
- Disciplinary actions
- International cooperation agreements

This framework is binding for all affiliated commissions, promoters, athletes, and officials operating under WBC Eurasia jurisdiction.

SECTION 2: GOVERNANCE, AUTHORITY & STRUCTURAL FRAMEWORK

2.1 Organizational Authority

WBC Eurasia operates as a continental governing body under delegated authority aligned with the World Boxing Council (WBC). It shall exercise regulatory oversight over professional boxing activities within its jurisdiction in accordance with international sporting governance principles and applicable national laws.

2.2 Jurisdictional Scope

WBC Eurasia jurisdiction includes Europe, the Middle East, Central Asia, South Asia, and affiliated territories where formally recognized.

Jurisdiction applies to:

- Professional bouts and events
 - Licensed athletes, officials, and promoters
 - Regional championship titles and rankings
 - Regulatory compliance and disciplinary enforcement
-

2.3 Relationship with National Authorities

WBC Eurasia recognizes the sovereignty of national athletic commissions and governmental sports authorities. Cooperation shall include:

- Mutual recognition of licensing standards where applicable
- Coordination on medical, safety, and disciplinary matters
- Compliance with local laws governing sporting events

In case of conflict, applicable national law shall prevail, provided WBC safety and integrity standards are not compromised.

2.4 Sanctioning Authority

WBC Eurasia holds exclusive authority to sanction regional championship bouts and approved contests within its jurisdiction. No bout may proceed without formal approval.

Sanctioning includes:

- Appointment of officials
 - Authorization of rankings eligibility
 - Event compliance oversight
 - Enforcement of WBC Eurasia regulations
-

2.5 Disciplinary Jurisdiction

WBC Eurasia may investigate and adjudicate violations involving:

- Regulatory non-compliance
- Ethical misconduct
- Medical violations
- Fraud or manipulation of competition

Sanctions may include suspension, fines, license revocation, or ranking removal.

2.6 Binding Authority Clause

All participants operating under WBC Eurasia jurisdiction agree to comply with its regulations, decisions, and enforcement actions. Participation constitutes acceptance of full regulatory authority.

SECTION 3: LICENSING SYSTEM & REGULATORY COMPLIANCE FRAMEWORK

3.1 Licensing Authority

WBC Eurasia holds exclusive authority to issue, renew, suspend, and revoke all licenses required for participation in professional boxing activities within its jurisdiction.

All licensing decisions shall be governed by WBC Eurasia regulations and aligned with World Boxing Council (WBC) standards.

3.2 Licensed Categories

The following categories of licenses are recognized:

- Professional Boxers
- Promoters and Co-Promoters
- Managers and Seconds
- Referees and Judges
- Ringside Officials and Supervisors
- Medical Personnel
- Matchmakers and Regulatory Agents

Each category shall be subject to specific eligibility, training, and compliance requirements.

3.3 Application and Eligibility

All applicants must:

- Submit verified identification documentation
- Meet medical fitness requirements where applicable
- Agree to WBC Eurasia Code of Conduct
- Pass background and integrity screening where required

Additional category-specific requirements may apply.

3.4 Licensing Validity and Renewal

Licenses shall:

- Be issued for a defined validity period
- Require periodic renewal
- Be contingent upon ongoing compliance with medical, ethical, and regulatory standards

Failure to renew shall result in automatic suspension of privileges.

3.5 Suspension and Revocation

WBC Eurasia may suspend or revoke licenses for:

- Regulatory violations
- Medical ineligibility
- Ethical misconduct
- Anti-doping violations
- Fraud or misrepresentation

Suspended individuals shall be ineligible for participation in any sanctioned activity.

3.6 Central Licensing Registry

WBC Eurasia shall maintain a centralized digital registry of all licensed participants including:

- License status
- Medical clearance status
- Disciplinary history
- Suspension records

Only individuals listed as active in the registry may participate in sanctioned events.

3.7 Cross-Border Recognition

WBC Eurasia shall cooperate with national and international commissions to ensure:

- Mutual recognition of suspensions
 - Verification of licensing status
 - Enforcement of disciplinary actions across jurisdictions

3.8 Compliance Enforcement

Failure to comply with licensing requirements may result in:

- Event disqualification
 - Financial penalties
 - Suspension of promoter or participant privileges
 - Permanent revocation of licensing rights

3.9 Binding Regulatory Effect

All licensed participants agree that WBC Eurasia licensing decisions are final, binding, and enforceable within its jurisdiction and affiliated regulatory frameworks.

SECTION 4: CHAMPIONSHIP STRUCTURE, TITLE GOVERNANCE & ELIGIBILITY FRAMEWORK

4.1 General Championship Authority

WBC Eurasia shall have full regulatory authority over the recognition, sanctioning, and governance of all regional championship titles within its jurisdiction, in alignment with World Boxing Council (WBC) global championship standards.

All championship contests shall be considered regulated events subject to strict eligibility, ranking, medical, and compliance requirements.

4.2 Championship Hierarchy

WBC Eurasia shall recognize the following structured championship levels:

- WBC Eurasia Youth Championship
- WBC Eurasia Silver Championship
- WBC Eurasia Continental Championship
- WBC Eurasia International Championship

Each level represents a progressive stage within the regional championship system and serves as a pathway toward global WBC contention.

4.3 Title Eligibility Criteria

A boxer may be eligible to compete for a WBC Eurasia title only if they meet the following conditions:

- Active WBC Eurasia professional license
- Medical clearance and compliance with safety requirements
- Approval by WBC Eurasia Ratings and Championship Committees
- Qualification through ranking position or sanctioned eliminator bout

Unranked boxers may only compete for titles under exceptional approval.

4.4 Mandatory Challenger System

Each championship division shall maintain a mandatory challenger designated by the Ratings Committee.

Requirements:

- Champions must defend against mandatory challengers within prescribed timeframes
 - Failure to comply may result in title vacancy or interim championship authorization
 - Mandatory challengers shall be selected based on merit, rankings, and regulatory compliance
-

4.5 Interim Championships

An interim championship may be sanctioned when:

- A reigning champion is temporarily unable to defend due to medical or exceptional circumstances
- A division requires continuity of competition activity

Interim champions shall be required to face the reigning champion upon return to unify the title.

4.6 Title Vacancies

A championship title shall be declared vacant under the following conditions:

- Voluntary relinquishment by the champion
- Failure to meet mandatory defense obligations
- Medical inability to compete within required timeframe
- Disciplinary suspension or regulatory violation

Vacant titles shall be contested by top-ranked eligible contenders or as determined by the Championship Committee.

4.7 Championship Bout Sanctioning

All championship bouts must receive formal WBC Eurasia sanctioning approval, including:

- Verification of eligibility of both competitors
- Confirmation of rankings and challenger status

- Medical clearance and compliance review
- Appointment of officials and supervisory personnel

No championship bout may proceed without written authorization.

4.8 Weigh-In and Weight Class Compliance

All championship bouts shall adhere strictly to WBC-recognized weight divisions.

Requirements:

- Official weigh-in conducted under supervision
 - Compliance with contracted weight limits
 - Penalties for failure to make weight may include fines, title loss, or bout cancellation
-

4.9 Championship Recognition and Records

All WBC Eurasia championship outcomes shall be:

- Officially recorded in the WBC Eurasia registry
 - Recognized for ranking and global WBC consideration
 - Subject to validation by the Championship Committee
-

4.10 Championship Integrity Clause

Any attempt to manipulate championship outcomes, including:

- Match fixing
- Ranking manipulation
- Fraudulent eligibility claims

Shall result in immediate disciplinary action, including suspension, title stripping, and potential permanent ban.

4.11 Binding Championship Authority

All championship decisions made by WBC Eurasia, including eligibility, sanctioning, and title rulings, are final and binding within its jurisdiction.

SECTION 5: BOUT SANCTIONING, EVENT APPROVAL & COMPETITION OVERSIGHT

5.1 General Regulatory Authority

WBC Eurasia has exclusive authority over all bout approvals.

5.2 Event Application

Promoters must submit full event documentation.

5.3 Bout Classification

Non-title, ranking, eliminator, interim, championship.

5.4 Matchmaking Standards

Competitive fairness and medical safety required.

5.5 Medical Pre-Approval

Mandatory clearance for all fighters.

5.6 Officials Assignment

WBC Eurasia assigns all officials.

5.7 Fight Night Authorization

Final approval by supervisor.

5.8 Cancellation Policy

Medical, safety, or compliance grounds.

5.9 Post-Event Reporting

Mandatory supervisor reporting.

5.10 Enforcement

Penalties for violations.

5.11 Binding Clause

All decisions are final and enforceable.

SECTION 6: MEDICAL, SAFETY & RINGSIDE PROTOCOLS

6.1 General Medical Authority

WBC Eurasia prioritizes athlete health and safety above all competitive or commercial interests. Medical rulings are final and binding in all contest-related decisions.

6.2 Pre-Fight Medical Requirements

All boxers must complete:

- Full physical examination
- Neurological assessment
- Cardiovascular screening
- Blood and infectious disease testing
- Ophthalmological evaluation where required

No athlete may compete without written medical clearance.

6.3 Ringside Medical Staffing

Each event must include:

- Licensed ringside physician(s)
- Emergency medical team
- Ambulance on standby
- Defined hospital transfer route

6.4 Authority to Stop Contest

The following may stop a bout at any time:

- Referee (primary authority)
- Ringside physician (medical authority)
- WBC Eurasia supervisor (regulatory authority)

6.5 Post-Bout Medical Evaluation

Mandatory post-fight checks include:

- Neurological assessment
- Injury documentation
- Concussion evaluation where applicable

6.6 Medical Suspension System

Automatic suspensions may be imposed following:

- Knockout losses
- Technical knockout due to head trauma
- Serious injury or medical concern

Suspension duration shall be determined by medical review.

6.7 Emergency Protocols

In the event of serious injury:

- Bout is immediately stopped
 - Medical team assumes control
 - Emergency transport activated
 - Incident report submitted to WBC Eurasia
-

6.8 Equipment Safety Standards

All equipment must meet approved standards including:

- Gloves
- Hand wraps
- Mouthguards
- Protective gear compliance

Non-compliant equipment shall be replaced or rejected.

6.9 Weight Cutting & Hydration Safety

Unsafe weight reduction practices are strictly prohibited. Medical staff may intervene where dehydration or extreme weight loss presents risk.

6.10 Binding Medical Authority

All medical decisions made under WBC Eurasia authority are final, enforceable, and take precedence over all sporting considerations.

SECTION 7: OFFICIALS, REFEREES & JUDGING STANDARDS

7.1 General Authority

WBC Eurasia shall regulate, license, and oversee all referees, judges, and officials operating within its jurisdiction. All officiating personnel are subject to WBC Eurasia performance standards and ethical codes.

7.2 Licensing of Officials

All officials must obtain and maintain a valid WBC Eurasia license, requiring:

- Completion of approved training programs
 - Competency examinations
 - Ongoing performance evaluation
 - Periodic re-certification
-

7.3 Referee Responsibilities

Referees shall:

- Enforce rules of competition at all times
 - Prioritize fighter safety above all considerations
 - Have authority to stop contests immediately when necessary
 - Maintain neutrality and avoid all conflicts of interest
-

7.4 Judging Criteria

Judges shall score bouts based on:

- Effective clean punching
- Ring generalship
- Defense
- Effective aggression

Scores must be recorded round-by-round and submitted immediately post-bout.

7.5 Scoring System

All WBC Eurasia bouts shall use the 10-point must system unless otherwise authorized.

- Winner of round: 10 points
 - Loser of round: 9 points or fewer based on knockdowns or dominance
-

7.6 Officials Conduct Standards

Officials must adhere to:

- Impartiality and neutrality
- Zero tolerance for corruption or manipulation

- Strict confidentiality regarding scoring deliberations
-

7.7 Appointment of Officials

WBC Eurasia shall assign all officials to sanctioned events. No promoter or team may select their own officials.

7.8 Performance Review & Accountability

Officials will be evaluated based on:

- Accuracy of scoring
- Rule enforcement consistency
- Decision quality
- Professional conduct

Poor performance may result in suspension or revocation of license.

7.9 Conflict of Interest Policy

Officials must disclose any personal, financial, or professional relationships with participants. Any conflict shall result in reassignment.

7.10 Binding Authority Clause

All officiating decisions rendered during a contest are final at ringside, subject only to WBC Eurasia regulatory review post-event.

SECTION 8: DISCIPLINARY CODE & ETHICS ENFORCEMENT SYSTEM

8.1 General Authority

WBC Eurasia maintains full disciplinary authority over all licensed participants, including boxers, promoters, managers, trainers, officials, and medical personnel.

8.2 Categories of Violations

Violations include but are not limited to:

- Misconduct or unsportsmanlike behavior
 - Fraud or match manipulation
 - Doping or substance abuse violations
 - Medical non-compliance
 - Breach of regulatory procedures
 - Corruption or bribery
-

8.3 Disciplinary Actions

WBC Eurasia may impose:

- Verbal or written warnings
 - Financial fines
 - Suspension (temporary or indefinite)
 - License revocation
 - Title stripping
 - Lifetime bans in severe cases
-

8.4 Investigation Procedures

All allegations shall be subject to formal investigation including:

- Evidence collection
- Witness statements
- Review of official documentation
- Collaboration with medical and regulatory departments

8.5 Due Process Rights

All accused parties shall be granted:

- Written notice of allegations
- Opportunity to respond
- Fair hearing before disciplinary panel
- Right to present evidence

8.6 Appeals Process

Decisions may be appealed to the WBC Eurasia Appeals Committee within defined time limits. Appeals must be based on procedural error or new evidence.

8.7 Emergency Suspension Authority

WBC Eurasia may impose immediate suspensions pending investigation where athlete safety, integrity, or regulatory compliance is at risk.

8.8 Integrity & Ethics Unit

An independent Integrity Unit shall oversee investigations involving corruption, doping, and manipulation of competition.

8.9 Confidentiality Clause

All disciplinary proceedings shall remain confidential until resolution, except where disclosure is required for regulatory enforcement.

8.10 Binding Enforcement Clause

All disciplinary rulings issued by WBC Eurasia are final, binding, and enforceable within its jurisdiction and affiliated regulatory frameworks.

SECTION 9: DISCIPLINARY CODE, ETHICS & APPEALS SYSTEM

9.1 General Principle of Discipline and Integrity

WBC Eurasia shall maintain a strict disciplinary framework to preserve the integrity, safety, and credibility of professional boxing within its jurisdiction. All participants are bound by the highest standards of ethical conduct, sportsmanship, and regulatory compliance. Disciplinary authority shall be exercised fairly, consistently, and in accordance with due process.

9.2 Scope of Disciplinary Authority

WBC Eurasia disciplinary jurisdiction applies to: Professional boxers Promoters and event organizers Managers and seconds Referees, judges, and officials Licensed medical personnel Any affiliated license holders or participants Violations may occur inside or outside the ring, provided they impact the integrity of the sport or WBC Eurasia operations.

9.3 Code of Ethics

All participants shall adhere to the following core ethical principles:

9.3.1 Integrity Participants must act honestly and avoid any conduct that compromises the legitimacy of competition.

9.3.2 Fair Play No participant shall engage in: Match manipulation Intentional underperformance Illegal betting activity Collusion or bout fixing

9.3.3 Respect and Professional Conduct All individuals must maintain respectful conduct toward: Opponents Officials Medical personnel WBC Eurasia representatives

9.3.4 Compliance All participants must comply with: WBC Eurasia rules and regulations Medical and safety requirements Licensing obligations Anti-doping policies

9.4 Category of Violations

9.4.1 Minor Violations May include: Administrative non-compliance Failure to meet reporting requirements Minor unsportsmanlike conduct Sanctions: Warning Fine Probation

9.4.2 Major Violations May include: Repeated rule breaches Severe unsportsmanlike conduct Failure to comply with official instructions Breach of event protocols Sanctions: Suspension Financial penalties Removal from rankings or assignments

9.4.3 Severe Violations May include: Doping violations Bout manipulation or fixing Assault on officials or participants Fraud or forgery of documentation Gross misconduct affecting sport integrity Sanctions: Long-term or indefinite suspension Lifetime ban Title stripping Referral to legal authorities where applicable

9.5 Disciplinary Procedures

9.5.1 Initiation of Proceedings Disciplinary action may be initiated by: WBC Eurasia officials Event supervisors Medical committee reports Official complaints or investigations

9.5.2 Investigation Process WBC Eurasia shall conduct a formal review process including: Evidence collection Witness statements Video and documentation review Official reporting analysis

9.5.3 Notification The accused party shall receive: Written notice of allegations Summary of evidence Timeline for response

9.5.4 Right to Response All parties have the right to: Respond to allegations Submit evidence Request a hearing

9.5.5 Hearing Procedure Where required, a disciplinary hearing shall: Be conducted by an appointed panel Ensure impartiality and fairness Allow representation or legal counsel (where applicable) Evaluate all evidence before rendering a decision

9.5 Disciplinary Procedures

WBC Eurasia may impose one or more of the following: Written warning Monetary fine Probationary status Suspension (fixed-term or indefinite) Revocation of license Removal from rankings or titles Lifetime ban from WBC Eurasia activities Sanctions shall be proportionate to the severity of the violation.

9.6 Disciplinary Sanctions

WBC Eurasia may impose one or more of the following: Written warning Monetary fine Probationary status Suspension (fixed-term or indefinite) Revocation of license Removal from rankings or titles Lifetime ban from WBC Eurasia activities Sanctions shall be proportionate to the severity of the violation.

9.7 Emergency Suspension Powers

WBC Eurasia reserves the right to impose immediate provisional suspension if: Athlete or participant safety is at risk There is credible evidence of severe misconduct Ongoing participation may compromise event integrity Such suspensions remain in effect pending full investigation.

9.8 Appeals System

9.8.1 Right to Appeal Any sanctioned party has the right to appeal disciplinary decisions, except where explicitly restricted by emergency rulings.

9.8.2 Appeals Committee Appeals shall be reviewed by the WBC Eurasia Appeals Committee, which shall: Be independent from the original disciplinary panel Review procedural fairness and evidence validity Ensure consistency with WBC Eurasia regulations

9.8.3 Grounds for Appeal Appeals may be submitted on grounds of: Procedural error New evidence Excessive or disproportionate sanction Misinterpretation of rules

9.8.4 Appeals Outcome The Appeals Committee may: Uphold the original decision Modify sanctions Overturn the ruling Order a new hearing All appeal decisions are final and binding.

9.9 Public Disclosure of Decisions

WBC Eurasia may publish disciplinary outcomes to ensure transparency, subject to: Privacy considerations Ongoing investigations Legal constraints.

9.10 Public Disclosure of Decisions

Record Keeping: All disciplinary actions shall be: Documented in the official WBC Eurasia registry Considered in future licensing and eligibility decisions Shared with relevant commissions where applicable.

9.11 Rehabilitation and Reinstatement

WBC Eurasia may consider reinstatement of suspended individuals based on: Completion of suspension period Demonstrated rehabilitation Medical or ethical clearance (where applicable) Committee approval.

9.12 Binding Authority

All disciplinary decisions and appeal rulings issued under WBC Eurasia authority are final, binding, and enforceable within its jurisdiction and affiliated systems.

SECTION 10: EVENT OPERATIONS, SACTIONING STANDARDS & FIGHT NIGHT PROTOCOLS

10.1 General Principle of Event Governance

All WBC Eurasia-sanctioned events shall be conducted under strict regulatory oversight to ensure safety, professionalism, and compliance with World Boxing Council (WBC) standards. Every event shall be treated as a regulated sporting operation, requiring full approval, supervision, and post-event reporting.

10.2 Event Sanctioning Requirements

No boxing event shall be conducted under WBC Eurasia jurisdiction without official sanctioning approval. Required Pre-Event Submissions: Promoters must submit: Full event proposal and fight card Boxer licensing and medical documentation Venue certification and safety compliance reports Insurance coverage verification Security and emergency response plan Broadcast and media agreements (if applicable).

10.2.1 Sanctioning Decision Outcomes Events may be: Fully sanctioned Conditionally sanctioned (pending compliance) Deferred for further review Denied sanctioning No promotional activity may proceed without written approval.

10.3 Venue Standards & Requirements

All event venues must meet WBC Eurasia standards including:

10.3.1 Safety Compliance Structural integrity certification Fire safety approval
Emergency evacuation routes Controlled access points

10.3.2 Ringside Medical Infrastructure Designated medical station Ambulance on standby with evacuation clearance Clear access route for emergency transport Fully equipped trauma response capability

10.3.3 Seating & Operational Zones Venues must include: Designated fighter areas
Official judges' and referee positions Neutral supervisor station Secure locker rooms
Controlled media zones

10.4 Boxing Ring Specifications

All rings used in WBC Eurasia events must comply with standardized specifications: Square ring structure approved for professional competition Certified ropes, corner pads, and flooring Non-slip

canvas surface Proper lighting ensuring full visibility Safety padding meeting WBC standards Ring inspection shall be completed prior to event commencement.

10.5 Fight Night Operational Structure

10.5.1 Event Command Structure Each event shall include: WBC Eurasia Supervisor (lead authority) Referee and judging panel Ringside physicians Event promoter and operations team Security and emergency personnel

10.5.2 Pre-Event Checklist Before the first bout begins: Medical clearances verified Weigh-in results confirmed Officials assigned and briefed Ring inspected and approved Emergency protocols confirmed Fighter equipment checked

10.5.3 Fighter Preparation Protocol All boxers must: Be cleared by medical personnel Be weighed and confirmed within division limits Present approved equipment (gloves, wraps, attire) Be escorted under official supervision

10.6 Bout Conduct Regulations

During all contests: Only licensed seconds may be present in corners Referee commands must be obeyed immediately No unauthorized communication with fighters is permitted Ringside medical staff may intervene at any time.

10.7 Security & Crowd Management

10.7.1 Security Requirements Promoters must ensure: Professional security personnel on-site Controlled access to restricted areas Separation of athletes, officials, and public zones Emergency crowd control capability

10.7.2 Incident Response In the event of disruption: Security shall restore order immediately WBC Eurasia Supervisor may pause or suspend the event Law enforcement may be engaged if necessary

10.8 Broadcast & Media Standards

Where events are broadcast: Production must not interfere with regulatory oversight Ringside officials must remain unobstructed Camera placement must not compromise safety or officiating All broadcast content must comply with WBC Eurasia branding and integrity standards.

10.9 Equipment & Compliance Checks

All fight equipment shall be inspected for: Gloves (approved weight and condition) Hand wraps (proper application standards) Mouthguards Protective gear compliance Non-compliant equipment shall be replaced or disallowed.

10.10 Bout Stoppage Authority During Events

The following authorities may stop a bout at any time: Referee (primary authority) Ringside physician (medical authority) WBC Eurasia Supervisor (regulatory intervention in extreme cases) Safety decisions shall always override promotional or competitive considerations.

10.11 Post-Event Reporting

Following each event, the Supervisor shall submit: Official bout results Medical incident reports Officiating performance evaluations Rule compliance report Any disciplinary or regulatory incidents This report shall form part of the official WBC Eurasia record.

10.12 Incident and Emergency Protocols

In the event of serious injury or emergency: Bout shall be immediately halted Medical team assumes full control Emergency transport procedures activated WBC Eurasia notified immediately A full investigation report shall follow any critical incident.

10.13 Compliance Enforcement

Failure to comply with event operational standards may result in: Suspension of sanctioning privileges, Financial penalties, Disqualification of event results, Revocation of promoter license.

10.14 Binding Operational Authority

All event operations fall under the jurisdiction of WBC Eurasia. All participants, promoters, and officials agree that regulatory instructions issued by WBC Eurasia Supervisors are final and must be followed without delay.

SECTION 11: RANKINGS SYSTEM, RECORDS & STATISTICAL GOVERNANCE

11.1 General Principle of Rankings Integrity

Eurasia shall maintain a transparent, merit-based, and continuously updated rankings system to ensure fair competition and clear pathways toward championship opportunities. All rankings shall reflect sporting performance, regulatory compliance, and competitive merit in accordance with World Boxing Council (WBC) standards.

11.2 Authority Over Rankings

The WBC Eurasia Ratings Committee shall have exclusive authority over: Creation and maintenance of regional rankings Evaluation of boxer performance Inclusion or removal from rankings Resolution of ranking disputes All ranking decisions are subject to final approval by WBC Eurasia governance bodies.

11.3 Ranking Criteria

Rankings shall be determined using a comprehensive evaluation system including:

11.3.1 Competitive Performance Win-loss record Quality of opposition Method of victory (KO, TKO, decision) Recent activity and form

11.3.2 Opponent Strength Victories over ranked opponents Championship bout participation Performance in eliminators and title fights

11.3.3 Activity Level Frequency of competition Period of inactivity Compliance with mandatory defense or bout requirements 11.3.4 Regulatory Compliance Medical clearance status Disciplinary record Licensing validity Anti-doping compliance

11.4 Ranking Structure

WBC Eurasia shall maintain official rankings per weight division: Champion (1st position, separate classification) Mandatory Challenger Top Contenders (Ranked positions 1–15 or as defined per division) Contender Pool (unranked but eligible fighters).

11.5 Champion Classification in Rankings

A reigning champion: Shall not occupy a standard ranking position Shall be classified separately as “Champion” May be designated mandatory defense obligations by the Ratings Committee.

11.6 Ranking Updates and Frequency

Rankings shall be updated: On a scheduled monthly basis (minimum requirement) Following major championship or eliminator bouts After disciplinary rulings affecting eligibility Emergency updates may be issued where necessary to maintain integrity.

11.7 Entry and Removal from Rankings

11.7.1 Entry Criteria A boxer may enter rankings upon: Significant competitive victories Approval by Ratings Committee Compliance with licensing and medical requirements

11.7.2 Removal Criteria A boxer may be removed from rankings due to: Extended inactivity Defeat in key eliminator or title bouts Medical suspension or ineligibility Disciplinary sanctions Voluntary retirement or inactivity declaration

11.8 Mandatory Challenger Designation

The Ratings Committee may designate a mandatory challenger based on: Highest ranked eligible contender Competitive merit and recent performance Championship activity requirements Failure by a champion to comply may result in: Title vacancy Interim championship authorization Reordering of rankings.

11.9 Record Keeping Standards

WBC Eurasia shall maintain an official centralized record system including: Fighter professional records Bout outcomes and methods of victory Opponent history and ranking changes Championship lineage history All records shall be considered official and binding for regulatory purposes.

11.10 Statistical Integrity and Verification

To ensure accuracy, WBC Eurasia shall: Cross-verify bout results with official supervisors Validate records through sanctioned event reports Maintain audit trails for all ranking changes Disputed records shall be reviewed by the Ratings Committee.

11.11 Data Governance and Transparency

Ranking data shall be: Securely stored within WBC Eurasia systems Accessible to authorized officials and commissions Periodically published for transparency Confidential medical or disciplinary information shall remain protected.

11.12 Ranking Appeals Process

Boxers or licensed parties may request review of ranking decisions based on: Statistical or record inaccuracies Procedural errors New validated competitive results The Ratings Committee shall review and issue final determinations.

11.13 Pathway to Championship Contention

Rankings shall serve as the official pathway to: WBC Eurasia Youth, Silver, Continental, and International titles Regional eliminators Global WBC ranking advancement opportunities Only ranked or approved contenders may be eligible for championship consideration unless otherwise authorized.

11.14 Integrity of Rankings System

Any attempt to manipulate rankings through: Fraud Bribery Misrepresentation of records Undisclosed conflicts of interest Shall result in immediate disciplinary action, including suspension or permanent removal.

11.15 Binding Authority

All rankings issued by WBC Eurasia are official, binding, and enforceable within its jurisdiction and recognized affiliate systems.

SECTION 12: ANTI-DOPING, INTEGRITY & COMPLIANCE FRAMEWORK

12.1 General Principle of Clean Sport

WBC Eurasia is fully committed to the principles of clean sport, fair competition, and athlete health protection. The use of prohibited substances or methods to enhance performance is strictly forbidden. All participants shall compete on the basis of natural ability, skill, preparation, and fair athletic competition in alignment with World Boxing Council (WBC) global standards and internationally recognized anti-doping principles.

12.2 Anti-Doping Authority

The WBC Eurasia Medical & Integrity Division shall oversee all anti-doping operations, including: Testing protocols Sample collection procedures Results management Sanction enforcement Education and compliance programs WBC Eurasia may collaborate with recognized international anti-doping organizations and accredited laboratories.

12.3 Prohibited Substances and Methods

All athletes and licensed participants are strictly prohibited from using: Performance-enhancing anabolic agents Hormonal and metabolic modulators Blood doping or oxygen-enhancing methods Masking agents Any substance banned under internationally recognized anti-doping lists. The use of prohibited methods, including tampering with samples or evasion of testing, is equally forbidden.

12.4 Testing Procedures

12.4.1 In-Competition Testing WBC Eurasia may conduct testing: Before bouts (fight week) Immediately after bouts Randomly during event periods

12.4.2 Out-of-Competition Testing Athletes may be tested at any time, including: Training camps Rest periods Unannounced inspections

12.4.3 Sample Collection Protocol All sample collection shall: Be conducted by authorized personnel Follow chain-of-custody procedures Ensure athlete identification verification Maintain sample integrity until laboratory analysis

12.5 Athlete Whereabouts and Availability

Athletes may be required to: Provide location information during training periods Remain available for random testing Update contact and training camp details as required Failure to comply may result in testing violations.

12.6 Results Management Process

12.6.1 Adverse Analytical Findings If a test returns a positive result: Athlete shall be formally notified A review process shall be initiated Athlete may request analysis of the B sample

12.6.2 Disciplinary Review Confirmed violations shall be reviewed by the Disciplinary & Ethics Committee, which may impose sanctions in accordance with this Manual.

12.7 Sanctions for Anti-Doping

Violations Sanctions may include: Immediate suspension from competition Disqualification of bout results Stripping of titles or rankings Financial penalties Long-term or lifetime bans Severity shall depend on: Substance type Intentionality Prior violations Level of competition impact.

12.8 Athlete Responsibility Principle

All athletes are strictly responsible for any substance found in their body, regardless of intent or source. Claims of ignorance shall not exempt responsibility.

12.9 Therapeutic Use Exemptions (TUEs)

Athletes requiring prohibited substances for legitimate medical reasons must: Apply for prior authorization Submit full medical documentation Obtain approval from WBC Eurasia medical authorities Unauthorized use shall be considered a violation.

12.10 Integrity Monitoring System

WBC Eurasia shall implement integrity controls to detect and prevent: Match manipulation Betting-related corruption Ranking interference Licensing fraud Doping evasion schemes Monitoring may include: Data analysis Event supervision reports Whistleblower submissions Cross-jurisdiction cooperation.

12.11 Whistleblower Protection

Individuals reporting integrity violations shall be protected from: Retaliation Harassment. Professional discrimination Reports shall be treated confidentially and investigated appropriately.

12.12 Collaboration with Global Anti-Doping Bodies

WBC Eurasia shall cooperate with: International anti-doping agencies Accredited laboratories National sporting authorities World Boxing Council integrity systems Such cooperation ensures global consistency and enforcement of clean sport principles.

12.13 Education and Prevention Programs

WBC Eurasia shall implement ongoing education for athletes and officials covering: Prohibited substances Testing procedures Health risks of doping Ethical responsibilities Education is mandatory for license renewal.

12.14 Appeals and Review

Athletes may appeal anti-doping decisions based on: Procedural error Laboratory error New scientific evidence Appeals shall be reviewed by an independent panel as defined in Section 9.

12.15 Binding Compliance Authority

All participants acknowledge that: Anti-doping regulations are strictly binding Violations may result in immediate suspension Decisions are enforceable under WBC Eurasia jurisdiction.
